

About Evusheld and COVID-19

What you need to know

Evusheld may not work against some variants of the virus that causes COVID-19. These variants are now the most common in the United States, and in the Midwest.

Other medications to prevent COVID-19 have not been developed. We continue to offer Evusheld for patients at high risk of severe COVID-19 illness.

But if you are exposed to one of the most common variants, it may not protect you from getting COVID-19.

What you need to do

Continue to avoid exposure to the virus that causes COVID-19.

- Wear a mask in public settings.
- Stay at least 6 feet away from people in public.
- Wash your hands often.
- Consider taking a COVID-19 at-home test and asking others to test before any social gatherings.

You, your close contacts and your caregivers should get the newest COVID-19 booster. Vaccines can help prevent severe COVID-19.

If you test positive for COVID-19, call your physician or advanced practice provider.

If your symptoms are serious, such as difficulty breathing or chest pain, go to the emergency department or call 911.
